WITNESS NUMBER 1:

The Bible

Many people think that they can base their faith on their feelings. The problem is when their feelings plummet, their faith goes down with them!

The Christian faith is based on something much more solid than feelings. It is based on what Jesus accomplished for us through His life, His death on the cross, and His resurrection. The Bible witnesses to these historical events, and it is through the Bible that you can become certain of your newfound faith.

But what is the Bible? The Bible is not a record of what people have thought about God; it is a record of what God thinks about us!

It is God's inspired message to human-kind. That is why Christians call it "the Word of God." The Bible is a book you can completely rely on to tell you the truth about God — and about yourself.

As Jesus said, Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will by no means pass away (Matthew 24:35).

Our feelings may come and go, but we can know that we are saved and accepted by God because the Bible says we are.

JESUS

UNDER NEW MANAGEMENT

When you become a Christian, the ownership of your life changes hands. In the past you were the boss, doing things in the way you saw best. For many people, this meant looking after themselves above everything else.

But now you have a **new boss**. You have given your life to Jesus Christ. This is what it means to be a Christian – Jesus is now in charge as the Lord of your life. The Apostle Paul said: "If you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved" (Romans 10:9).

What does this mean in practice? It means a **new way of life.** As we submit our lives to God and become His servants, we find an amazing new freedom. We are no longer the slaves of sin – instead, we are free to do good. As Jesus said, "I have come that they may have life, and that they may have it more abundantly" (John 10:10).

We find an amazing new freedom

We start to live out the life that Jesus called "the kingdom of God." In simple terms, this means accepting that God now rules us as our King. Jesus taught about this way of life in His famous "Sermon on the Mount," which you can find in Matthew chapters from 5 to 7.

Jesus said that when someone enters God's And we have already kingdom, or becomes a Christian, they are seen that Jesus said, born again. "Most assuredly, I [Jesus] say to I "Most assuredly, I you, unless one is born again, he cannot see say to you, he who the kingdom of God" (John 3:3).

When you were born your parents received a birth certificate, which you still use to prove your identity. You are who you are, no matter how you feel about it. Even if you were to suffer a memory loss, your identity would remain the same. Your birth certificate states who you are — and that settles it.

The same applies to what the Bible says about you. If you have received Jesus Christ into your life, then you have been born into God's family. The Bible is your birth certificate. It declares your identity even when you do not feel like a Christian, or if you forget it! We can trust the Bible to declare our new birth the same way we trust our original birth certificate.

And we have already seen that Jesus said, "Most assuredly, I say to you, he who hears My word and believes in Him who sent Me has everlasting life, and shall not come into judgment, but has passed from death into life" (John 5:24).

These are powerful words! They affirm that if you have repented and received Jesus, then you have eternal life and have crossed over from death to life. You can stake your life on it!

The disciple John put it boldly:

BELOVED, now we are children of God (1 John 3:2).

Meet with Jesus in the company of others. As Jesus Himself said: Where two or three are gathered together in My name, I am there in the midst of them (Matthew 18:20).




BAPTISM

As a new Christ follower, one of the most powerful lessons you can put into action is serving in the church; it's stepping outside of your comfort level and stepping up to serve others.




Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching.




UNDERSTANDING YOUR DECISION TO FOLLOW CHRIST



Ten Most Asked Questions About Tithing

In an effort to encourage the saints of God to give the Bible Way, Tithes and Offerings, and in full recognition of the misunderstanding that often surrounds it, I am submitting this dialogue of questions and answers in which I attempt to clear up some of the confusion. Tithing is God way and to fall short of that method is to come short of God perfect purpose for His church and His saints.

QUESTION #1: WHAT IS TITHING?

Answer: Tithing is percentage or proportionate giving. <u>Scriptural References</u>: Genesis 14:18-20 – Abraham gave tithes to the Priest Melchizedek, a <u>Tenth part of all he had</u>. Genesis 28:20-22 – Jacob promised God a Tenth of all he had.

QUESTION #2: WHY SHOULD I TITHE?

Answer: God Word commands that we do so. Scriptural Reference: Malachi 3: 6-12

QUESTION #3: BUT THAT IS AN OLD TESTAMENT SCRIPTURE, ISN'T TITHING A PART OF THE LAW? AREN'T WE NOW LIVING UNDER GRACE?

Answer: Of course we are under Grace, however, this does not exclude us from tithing. The first tithers lived and gave tithes <u>before</u> the Law was given. The standard for

giving, that is, Gods method for giving, was established <u>before</u> Moses was given the Law.

QUESTION #4: IF THIS IS TRUE, WHY DOESN'T THE NEW TESTAMENT PLACE EMPHASIS ON IT?

Answer: The New Testament church and writers took for granted the practice of tithing as the declared way of supporting the house of God. Scriptural References: Luke 18:10-14: Jesus used a parable to illustrate the difference between a Pharisee and his pride, and a publican, who was blessed because of his humbleness. However, within the parable, Jesus has the Pharisee say, "I fast twice in the week, I give tithes of all that I possess." It was not the fasting or the giving of tithes that brought the criticism, but rather the pride that caused the Pharisee to boast.

What he did was accepted, why he did it, was not. I believe that this is tangible evidence that Jesus accepted tithing as the <u>established</u> way of giving. Hebrews 7:8, "And <u>here</u> men that die <u>receive tithes</u>, but <u>there</u> He receiveth them of whom it is witnessed that He liveth." I Corinthians 16:2 Paul is obviously speaking of proportionate giving, a giving that is based on the <u>amount of income</u>. Indeed, for those who insist that the New Testament does not teach tithing, here is a good New Testament standard, which of course <u>exceeds</u> 10%.



Ten Most Asked Questions About Tithing Cont....

QUESTION #5 TO WHOM DO I PAY MY TITHES AND WHAT IS MEANT BY OFFERING?

Answer: Malachi tells us to bring our tithes into the storehouse, "that there may be meat in <u>mine</u> house, and prove me now herewith, saith the Lord of hosts." Malachi 3:10 Paul wrote to the church at Corinth, "Upon the first day of the week let everyone of you lay by him, <u>as God hath prospered him</u>." I Corinthians 16:2

These two scriptures indicate that your tithes are to be given to the <u>place of your feeding</u>. The pasture into which you as sheep are being nourished and fed by a shepherd (Pastor).

Secondly, the purpose of tithes has always been designated for the upkeep of the temple and priests. Numbers 18:20-21 records, "And the Lord spake unto Aaron. Thou shalt not have no inheritance in their land, neither shalt thou have any part among them: I am thy part and thine inheritance among the children of Israel. And, behold, I have given the children of Levi (priests) all the tenth in Israel for an inheritance, for their services which they serve, even the service of the tabernacle of the congregation."

Although the New Testament church developed into a highly structural organization and the Protestant church (among which, as Baptist, we stand) no longer hold to the Catholic concept of "priesthood," the principle of giving remains the same. The local church becomes our temple and the pastor-shepherd the spiritual leader (or priest).

WHAT ABOUT OFFERING? Tithes are that portion that we owe to God. Offerings are of that portion of giving that we give cheerfully and willingly, but beyond the responsibility of our tithes. The amount is voluntary and the motivation stems from a generosity.

QUESTION #6: DO I PAY TITHES FROM THE GROSS AMOUNT, THAT IS,THE AMOUNT THAT I RECEIVE BEFORE ANYTHING IS TAKEN OUT (E.G., SOCIAL SECURITY, INCOME TAX, ETC.) OR AM I ONLY OBLIGATED TO PAY THE 10% FROM THAT AMOUNT TAKEN HOME?

Answer: Admittedly, there seems to be some questions and honest difference of opinion between those who preach and teach tithing. Some believe that we are only commanded to pay from that which we actually receive. Others believe that we are obligated from the salary that we earn, regardless of what is taken from it. Proverb 3:9-10, commands that we, "Honor the Lord with thy substance and with the <u>first fruits</u> of all thine increase. So shall thy barns be filled with plenty and thy presses shall burst out with a new wine."

The Word would seem to indicate that if we give God from the top (gross), He will so bless that we need never worry about meeting our financial obligations. Since there is an honest opinion on both sides of the issue. I would never become dogmatic in support of either. However, I personally lean toward giving God from the top.

<u>QUESTION #7</u>: SUPPOSE MY HUSBAND OR MY WIFE DOES NOT BELIEVE IN TITHING, OR IS NOT A CHRISTIAN, SHOULD I DO SO ANYWAY?

Answer: If you <u>do not</u> work, and the income for the household comes from your mate, you <u>must not</u> insist on tithing from that source. However, if you have a personal source of income or an allowance for your own use, it would be quite proper to give a percentage, regardless of how small. Remember, it is <u>not</u> the amount, but the heart's desire. Never-the-less, the Word is supporting of family harmony and God would never be pleased with any deliberate or known effort to disrupt that unity <u>even in the name of</u> the church.

OUESTION #8: SUPPOSE I DON'T PAY TITHES?

Answer: It will not affect your salvation, but it does place you in the position of being Disobedient to a command from God. Tithing or proportionate giving is God's will and to not make an attempt to seek that will renders us beyond the kind of blessing that comes with obedience.

QUESTION #9: WHY SHOULD I PAY TITHES?

Answer:

- 1. Because we are commanded to do so.
- 2. Because we honor the Lord by doing so.
- 3. Because we show our love and obedience by doing so.

QUESTION #10: WHAT WILL TITHING NOT DO?

Answer:

- 1. It will not save you.
- 2. It will not buy a special place in heaven for you.
- 3. It will not influence God for you.

However, it will trigger the very windows of heaven that blessings will overtake you. For there is a principal which works for the <u>cheerful</u> giver. Luke 6:38, "Give, and it shall be given unto you: good measure, pressed down, and shaken together, and running over, shall men give into your bosom. For with the same measure that ye mete, withal, it shall be measured to you again. In other words, as you give, so are you given. II Corinthians 9:6-7, "But this I say, He which soweth sparingly shall <u>reap</u> also sparingly; and he which soweth bountifully shall reap bountifully. Every man according as he purposeth <u>in his heart</u>, so let him give, not grudgingly, or of necessity (forced); for God loveth a cheerful giver."

Tithing is God's way, and to fall short of that method, is to fall short of God's perfect purpose for His church and His saints.

Why I Love a Large Church

Why I Love a Large Church

Mt. Zion Church of Oakwood has become a large church. While we rejoice over the way the Lord has blessed this congregation, some who are not familiar with a large church are intimidated by it. There is a misconception that a big church is cold and formal or will neglect its people and compromise its principles.

There are dangers that are unique to a large congregation, just as there are to a small one, but there are also many advantages about a big church that make it special.

- 1. A large church is scriptural. The first church began with 3,000 members (Acts 2:41)! It grew every day until the number of men grew to about 5,000 (Acts 4:4). These people met in homes, but they also met together in the temple courts (Acts 2:46). We believe that when the Lord's hand is on His church, it will grow (Acts 11:21). Church growth will vary according to the size of the community and the receptivity of the people, but the church was meant to be an expanding body.
- 2. A large church can provide rich fellowship. The first church began with 3,000 members and they continued in the apostles' teaching and fellowship (Acts 2:42). They came to know and appreciate one another. In a large church, that fellowship is provided through many small group opportunities, such as adult Bible study, youth groups, children's ministry, and accountability groups.
- 3. A large church provides an excellent opportunity for evangelism. It is much easier to invite others to come to church with you if the church is large. There are many special services and quality programs that provide opportunities for Christian to invite friends and family members. Also, the unchurched are often more likely to attend since they do not feel threatened in a large group. Soon they begin to feel comfortable and the truths of the gospel sink in.
- **4.** A large church provides many opportunities for service. Some people assume they are not needed in a larger body. That's far from the truth. The large church has more opportunities to serve that in a small church because there are more positions to fill.
- 5. A large church is inspirational. Most of us enjoy going to athletic contests when there is a "packed house." There's something about a large number of people that creates excitement and generates energy. Jesus said He wanted His house to be full (Luke 14:23). It's inspirational to sing and share with thousands of Christians. It's thrilling to hear a large choir or to enjoy an excellent drama.
- **6.** A large church has a positive influence. There is strength in numbers. One church of several thousand has an opportunity to witness to and influence in missions and world outreach. Our size enables us to provide meaningful support ministries to those who need special attention.
- **7.** A large church prepares us for heaven! In Revelation 7:9 (NIV), the Apostle John described his vision of heaven, "...I looked and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne... wearing white robes..."

The large church has been used by God to evangelize the lost, edify the saved, minister to those in need and be a conscience in the community. We invite you to join us as we seek to glorify God's name in a big way.


